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Finished Woolly Block Size: 8" x 8"

Suggested Wools:

- 8" x 8" tan for background
- 6 1/2" x 7 1/2" red for barn
- 3 1/2" x 5" dark brown for roof and hayloft door
- 3 1/2" x 5" cream for roof trim
- 2" x 5" medium brown stripe for cart and baskets
- 2" x 3" gold for hay and gourds
- 3" x 3" orange for pumpkins and gourds
- 1" x 1" green for stems
- 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" black for wheels and handle
- Scraps of cream, red, green to make quilt block, if desired

Suggested Valdani Size 8 Pearl Cotton Colors:

P1 Old Brick
P4 Aged White Light
O178 Tea Dyed Stone
P5 Tarnished Gold
O548 Blackened Khaki

DMC 895 Floss for leaves and stems on gourds



Directions:

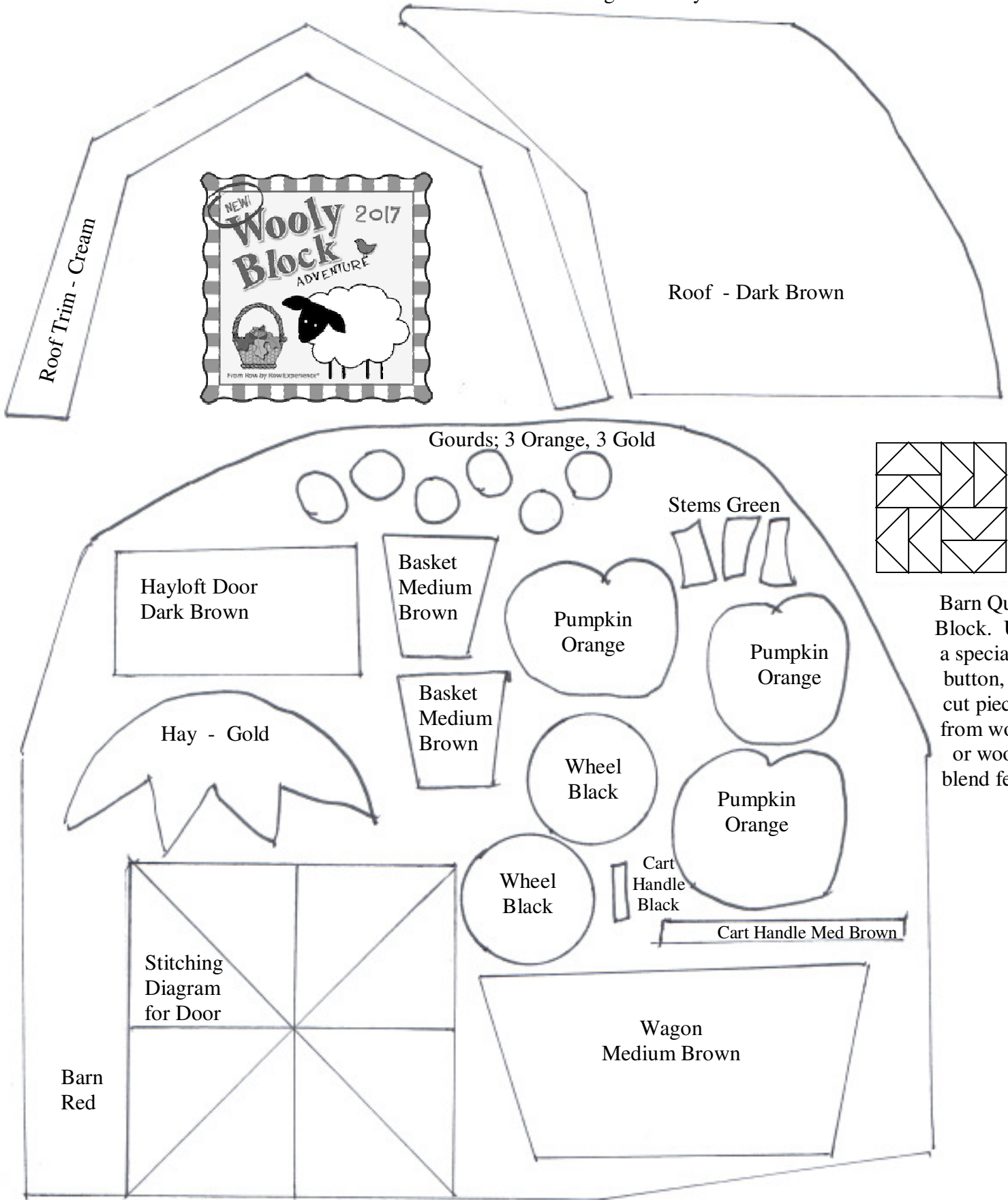
1. Cut background square 8" x 8".
2. Trace applique shapes onto smooth side of freezer paper. Cut out loosely around shapes. Iron to wool. Cut out along traced line. Remove freezer paper. (If you prefer, you can use your favorite fusible web project. Keep in mind that the designs have NOT been reversed, so if using fusible web, you'll need to trace in reverse.)
3. Position the applique shapes on the background block. Hold in place with small drops of Glue Baste It.
4. Blanket stitch applique shapes into place.
5. Backstitch the lines on the barn door.
6. Backstitch lines onto pumpkins, if desired.
7. Use a straight stitch to make a stem on each gourd. Add a lazy daisy for a leaf.
8. Stitch a specialty barn quilt block onto barn, if desired. You could also cut from wool or wool felt.

Optional Pillow:

1. If desired, center then blanket stitch the appliquéd block to a 12 1/2" square of flannel.
2. To make an envelope style back, cut two pieces of flannel 10" x 12 1/2". Sew a narrow hem on one 12 1/2" side of each piece. Overlap the hemmed edges to create a square 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".
3. Place pillow front and envelope back right sides together. Stitch around edges using a 1/4" seam. Turn right side out. Press.

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Designs are not reversed. We prefer to trace onto freezer paper and iron to the right side of our wools. If you prefer to use fusible web, you'll need to reverse the designs when you trace them.



Barn Quilt Block. Use a specialty button, or cut pieces from wool or wool blend felt.
